Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the NSW Budget is delivering \$2.1 billion for new and upgraded schools in regional NSW. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

Stage 2 of Jerrabomberra High School is underway to expand the school's capacity to 1,000 students to cater for future enrolment demand in the area.

Progress summary

Construction of the upgrade at Jerrabomberra High School continues to progress well, with several important milestones recently completed.

New pedestrian islands and a shared travel path on Coral Drive and Bicentennial Drive have now been completed, enhancing safety and accessibility for students travelling to and from school.

The extended staff car park has also been completed, providing an additional 35 parking spaces for staff while the new bike and scooter parking area was also recently completed, with both spaces expected to be handed over prior to the new building. These upgrades will provide students with more options for travelling to and from school.

Next steps

- Scaffolding will be completely removed to fully reveal the façade.
- Ongoing works to weatherproof and seal the building continue, protecting it from the weather.
- Hard and soft landscaping will begin across the site.
- Internal works including carpet installation, painting and classroom preparations for furniture installation.

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Students gain insight into careers in construction

Year 8 students recently had the opportunity to hear firsthand about the exciting world of construction during a special presentation delivered by project builder Hutchinsons.

Students were taken through the full lifecycle of building their new school building (Block E), from early planning and design through to construction and project completion. The session gave students insight into what life in the construction industry is like, the wide range of career opportunities available and the different training pathways into the industry.

Students also learned about careers they may not have previously considered, including project management, safety, various trades, and why women are encouraged to enter the industry. The presentation aimed to inspire students to think about future career pathways and where a career in construction could take them.
