

# Jerrabomberra High School Project update | August 2023

#### **Project overview**

Jerrabomberra High School opened on Day 1 Term 1 2023 in purpose built temporary facilities located at Jerrabomberra Public School. Construction of the new permanent high school is underway. It will have modern facilities, with 24 classrooms including 3 support classrooms, to accommodate approximately 500 students. It will deliver a library, multi-purpose hall, canteen, sports courts, covered outdoor learning area (COLA), outdoor space and administration facilities.

#### **Progress update**

Works are progressing well on site and are on track to be completed at the end of 2023.

The permanent school will be open for students on Day 1 Term 1 2024.

### **Development application for Stage 2**

The development application for Stage 2, which would expand the capacity of the school to 1,000 students, has been finalised and lodged with the Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council.

We will let you know when the development application is on public exhibition.




Stage 2 includes an additional building on the southern end of the site, which would house 18 additional classrooms, a vocational education and training (VET) kitchen and a semi-commercial kitchen.

There would also be additional staff facilitates, new play spaces and more car and bicycle parking. As a part of Stage 2 the semi-commercial kitchen in Block B of the Stage 1 build would be refurbished into a science lab. The proposed site plan is shown on the next page.
